



**SENATE AMENDMENT 4,
TO 1995 SENATE BILL 144**

September 27, 1995 – Offered by Senator ZIEN.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 8, line 8: after that line insert:

3 “(am) 1. When a respondent surrenders a firearm under par. (a) 2. to a sheriff,
4 the sheriff who is receiving the firearm shall prepare a receipt for each firearm
5 surrendered to him or her. The receipt shall include the manufacturer, model and
6 serial number of the firearm surrendered to the sheriff and shall be signed by the
7 respondent and by the sheriff to whom the firearm is surrendered.

8 2. The sheriff shall keep the original of a receipt prepared under subd. 1. and
9 shall provide an exact copy of the receipt to the respondent. When the firearm
10 covered by the receipt is returned to the respondent under par. (b), the sheriff shall
11 surrender to the respondent the original receipt and all of his or her copies of the
12 receipt.

13 3. A receipt prepared under subd. 1. is conclusive proof that the respondent
14 owns the firearm for purposes of returning the firearm covered by the receipt to the
15 respondent under par. (b).

1 4. The sheriff may not enter any information contained on a receipt prepared
2 under subd. 1. into any computerized or direct electronic data transfer system in
3 order to store the information or disseminate or provide access to the information.”.

4 **2.** Page 9, line 22: after that line insert:

5 “(am) 1. When a respondent surrenders a firearm under par. (a) 2. to a sheriff,
6 the sheriff who is receiving the firearm shall prepare a receipt for each firearm
7 surrendered to him or her. The receipt shall include the manufacturer, model and
8 serial number of the firearm surrendered to the sheriff and shall be signed by the
9 respondent and by the sheriff to whom the firearm is surrendered.

10 2. The sheriff shall keep the original of a receipt prepared under subd. 1. and
11 shall provide an exact copy of the receipt to the respondent. When the firearm
12 covered by the receipt is returned to the respondent under par. (b), the sheriff shall
13 surrender to the respondent the original receipt and all of his or her copies of the
14 receipt.

15 3. A receipt prepared under subd. 1. is conclusive proof that the respondent
16 owns the firearm for purposes of returning the firearm covered by the receipt to the
17 respondent under par. (b).

18 4. The sheriff may not enter any information contained on a receipt prepared
19 under subd. 1. into any computerized or direct electronic data transfer system in
20 order to store the information or disseminate or provide access to the information.”.

21 **3.** Page 11, line 8: after that line insert:

22 “(am) 1. When a respondent surrenders a firearm under par. (a) 2. to a sheriff,
23 the sheriff who is receiving the firearm shall prepare a receipt for each firearm
24 surrendered to him or her. The receipt shall include the manufacturer, model and

1 serial number of the firearm surrendered to the sheriff and shall be signed by the
2 respondent and by the sheriff to whom the firearm is surrendered.

3 2. The sheriff shall keep the original of a receipt prepared under subd. 1. and
4 shall provide an exact copy of the receipt to the respondent. When the firearm
5 covered by the receipt is returned to the respondent under par. (b), the sheriff shall
6 surrender to the respondent the original receipt and all of his or her copies of the
7 receipt.

8 3. A receipt prepared under subd. 1. is conclusive proof that the respondent
9 owns the firearm for purposes of returning the firearm covered by the receipt to the
10 respondent under par. (b).

11 4. The sheriff may not enter any information contained on a receipt prepared
12 under subd. 1. into any computerized or direct electronic data transfer system in
13 order to store the information or disseminate or provide access to the information.”.
