## SENATE AMENDMENT 6, TO SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 133

June 30, 1999 - Offered by Senators Farrow, Welch, Darling, Zien, Drzewiecki, Lazich and Panzer.

At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

"SECTION 722tg. 29.024 ( 2 g ) (title) of the statutes is amended to read:
29.024 ( $\mathbf{2 g}$ ) (title) DENIAL AND REVOCATION OF APPROVALS BASED ON CHILD SUPPORT DELINQUENCY; SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS.

SECTION 722tr. 29.024 (2g) (a) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:
29.024 (2g) (a) Social security numbers required. (intro.) The Except as provided in sub. (2m), the department shall require an applicant who is an individual to provide his or her social security number as a condition of applying for, or applying to renew, any of the following approvals:".
2. Page 473 , line 20: after that line insert:
"SECTION 722um. 29.024 (2m) of the statutes is created to read:
29.024 ( 2 m ) DENIAL and REVOCATION OF APPROVALS BASED ON CHILD SUPPORT DELINQUENCY; IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS. (a) Identification numbers required. The department shall require that an applicant display his or her operator's license under ch. 343 or identification card under s. 343.50 , as a condition of applying for, or applying to renew, any of the following approvals:

1. Resident small game hunting license.
2. Resident deer hunting license.
3. Class A bear license.
4. Class B bear license.
5. Resident archer hunting license.
6. Resident wild turkey hunting license.
7. Nonresident annual small game hunting license.
8. Nonresident 5-day small game hunting license.
9. Nonresident deer hunting license.
10. Nonresident fur-bearing animal hunting license.
11. Nonresident archer hunting license.
12. Nonresident wild turkey hunting license.
13. Resident annual fishing license.
14. Annual disabled person fishing license.
15. Resident annual husband and wife fishing license.
16. Resident 2-day sports fishing license.
17. Nonresident annual fishing license.
18. Nonresident annual family fishing license.
19. Nonresident 15-day fishing license.
20. Nonresident 15-day family fishing license.
21. Nonresident 4-day fishing license.
22. Nonresident 2-day sports fishing license.
23. Sturgeon spearing license.
24. Trapping license.
25. Resident sports license.
26. Nonresident sports license.
27. Resident conservation patron license.
28. Nonresident conservation patron license.
(b) Duplicates. For purposes of this subsection, an application for a duplicate of an approval specified under par. (a) shall be considered an application for the issuance of the approval.
(c) Denial of approvals. 1. As provided in the memorandum of understanding required under s. 49.857 (2), the department shall deny an application to issue or renew, suspend if already issued or otherwise withhold or restrict an approval specified in par. (a) if the applicant for or the holder of the approval fails to display his or her operator's license under ch. 343 or his or her identification card under s. 343.50 .
29. In lieu of displaying an operator's license or an identification card as required under subd. 1., the applicant for or holder of the approval may provide his or her social security number.".
30. Page 739, line 23: after that line insert:
"SECTION 1487m. $49.857(2 \mathrm{~m})$ of the statutes is created to read:
49.857 (2m) Notwithstanding sub. (2) (b) 4., the memorandum of understanding with the department of natural resources, under sub. (2) (b) may not
require a license applicant to provide or display his or her social security number under the system established by the department of workforce development. The memorandum of understanding with the department of natural resources may require the applicant to display his or her operator's license under ch. 343 or his or her identification card under s. 343.50.".
31. Page 1612, line 25: after that line insert:
"(9e) Identification numbers for certain approvals. The treatment of sections $29.024(2 \mathrm{~g})$ (title) and (a) (intro.) and ( 2 m ) and $49.857(2 \mathrm{~m})$ of the statutes takes effect on the first day of the 3rd month beginning after publication.".
