At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

Page 1426, line 12: after that line insert:
 "SECTION 3088s. 813.12 (8) (a) of the statutes is renumbered 813.12 (8) (a) 1.
 and amended to read:
 813.12 (8) (a) 1. Wheever Except as provided in subd. 2., whoever knowingly violates a temporary restraining order or injunction issued under sub. (3) or (4) shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned for not more than 9 months or both.

**Section 3088t.** 813.12 (8) (a) 2. of the statutes is created to read:

813.12 (8) (a) 2. Whoever knowingly violates a temporary restraining order or injunction issued under sub. (3) or (4) shall be imprisoned for not less than 5 days nor more than 9 months and may be fined not more than \$1,000 if, at any time preceding the violation, the person has been convicted of knowingly violating a temporary

restraining order or injunction issued under sub. (3) or (4). This subdivision applies whether the person previously violated the same temporary restraining order or injunction or a different temporary restraining order or injunction.".

## **2.** Page 1603, line 24: after that line insert:

"(3g) Violation of domestic abuse restraining orders. The treatment of section 813.12 (8) (a) 2. of the statutes first applies to violations of temporary restraining orders or injunctions that occur on the effective date of this subsection, but does not preclude counting violations that occurred before the effective date of this subsection for purposes of determining whether the person has previously been convicted of a violation of a temporary restraining order or injunction.".
