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**ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO 2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 169**

May 24, 2001 - Offered by Representative HOVEN.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 69.21 (3), 69.22 (1) (c) and 69.22 (1m); and *to create* 20.445
2 (3) (g), 49.135, 69.21 (2m) and 69.22 (1) (d) of the statutes; **relating to:** a child
3 care career education and training scholarship program, the sale of
4 commemorative birth certificates and marriage certificates to fund that
5 program, and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

6 **SECTION 1.** 20.445 (3) (g) of the statutes is created to read:
7 20.445 (3) (g) *Child care career education and training scholarships.* All
8 moneys received from fees under s. 69.22 (1) (d), as provided in s. 69.22 (1) (d), from
9 the sale of commemorative birth certificates and marriage certificates under s. 69.21
10 (2m), to be used for providing child care career education and training scholarships
11 under s. 49.135 (1) and for administering that scholarship program.

12 **SECTION 2.** 49.135 of the statutes is created to read:

1 **49.135 Child care career education and training. (1) CHILD CARE CAREER**
2 EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS. From the appropriation under s. 20.445 (3) (g), the
3 department or a nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation contracted with under sub. (3)
4 may award scholarships of not more than \$5,000 to individuals who are child care
5 providers or employed by a child care provider to enable those individuals to take
6 postsecondary, credit-based courses in the fields of child care or early childhood
7 education.

8 **(2) CHILD CARE CAREER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP CONTRACTS.** The department or
9 nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation contracted with under sub. (3) shall require a
10 scholarship recipient under sub. (1) and, if applicable, the child care provider
11 employing the scholarship recipient to enter into a contract with the department or
12 nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation specifying the commitments required of each
13 party to the contract. A contract under this subsection shall specify all of the
14 following terms and conditions:

15 (a) The amount of the scholarship, which, subject to the \$5,000 maximum limit
16 specified in sub. (1), may cover up to 100% of the cost of the scholarship recipient's
17 tuition and books.

18 (b) The time period of the contract (b) and the number of credit hours of instruction
19 that the scholarship recipient will take during that time period.

20 (c) A commitment by the scholarship recipient not to resign from employment
21 with the child care provider that employed the scholarship recipient during the time
22 period of the contract for at least 6 months after the end of that time period, as
23 specified in the contract; or, if the scholarship recipient is an individual who is a child
24 care provider, a commitment by the individual to remain a child care provider for at

1 least 6 months after the end of the time period in the contract, as specified in the
2 contract.

3 **(3) ADMINISTRATION.** From the appropriation under s. 20.445 (3) (g), the
4 department shall pay the costs of administering the scholarship program under this
5 section. The department may contract with a nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation, as
6 defined in s. 49.134 (1) (c), to administer the scholarship program under this section.

7 **SECTION 3.** 69.21 (2m) of the statutes is created to read:

8 **69.21 (2m) COMMEMORATIVE BIRTH CERTIFICATES AND MARRIAGE CERTIFICATES.** (a)
9 The state registrar shall issue a commemorative birth certificate or marriage
10 certificate commemorating the birth or marriage of any registrant who is the subject
11 of a birth certificate or marriage certificate that is registered in the office of the state
12 registrar to any person who submits a written request to the state registrar and pays
13 the fee specified in s. 69.22 (1) (d). A commemorative birth certificate or marriage
14 certificate issued under this subsection shall be considered an unverified copy of the
15 original birth certificate or marriage certificate and may not be considered a certified
16 copy of the original birth certificate or marriage certificate under sub. (1), or an
17 uncertified copy of the original birth certificate or marriage certificate under sub. (2).
18 No commemorative birth certificate or marriage certificate issued under this
19 subsection may include any information that is prohibited from disclosure under s.
20 69.20 (2).

21 (b) The state registrar shall prescribe a design for commemorative certificates
22 issued under this subsection so that the certificates are suitable for display. The
23 state registrar shall advertise that the certificates are available for sale and that the
24 proceeds from the sales will be used to provide child care career education and
25 training scholarships under s. 49.135. A commemorative certificate issued under

1 this subsection shall have on its face the following text: "UNVERIFIED COPY. Not
2 valid for identification purposes."

3 **SECTION 4.** 69.21 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 69.21 (3) AMENDMENTS. Any copy of a vital record issued under this section,
5 except a commemorative birth certificate or marriage certificate issued under sub.
6 (2m), shall show all amendments or changes made on the record since it was filed,
7 and the date and authority of the amendment or change unless a certificate was
8 issued for the registrant under s. 69.14 (1) (h) or 69.15 (2), (3) or (4) (b).

9 **SECTION 5.** 69.22 (1) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

10 69.22 (1) (c) ~~Twelve dollars~~ Except as provided in par. (d), \$12 for issuing a copy
11 of a birth certificate, \$7 of which shall be forwarded to the state treasurer as provided
12 in sub. (1m) and credited to the appropriations under s. 20.433 (1) (g) and (h).

13 **SECTION 6.** 69.22 (1) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

14 69.22 (1) (d) Forty-two dollars for issuing a commemorative birth certificate
15 or marriage certificate under s. 69.21 (2m), \$35 of which shall be credited to the
16 appropriation under s. 20.445 (3) (g) and used to provide child care career education
17 and training scholarships under s. 49.135 (1) and to administer that scholarship
18 program, and \$7 of which shall be credited to the appropriation under s. 20.435 (8)
19 (kx) and used to pay for the costs of administering the sale of commemorative birth
20 certificates and marriage certificates under s. 69.21 (2m).

21 **SECTION 7.** 69.22 (1m) of the statutes is amended to read:

22 69.22 (1m) The By the 15th day of the first month following the end of each
23 calendar quarter, the state registrar and any local registrar acting under this
24 subchapter shall forward to the state treasurer the amount specified in sub. (1) (c)
25 for each copy of a birth certificate issued during a the calendar quarter ~~by the 15th~~

1 ~~day of the first month following the end of the calendar quarter~~ and the state
2 registrar shall forward to the state treasurer the amount specified in sub. (1) (d) for
3 each commemorative birth certificate or marriage certificate issued during the
4 calendar quarter.
