SENATE AMENDMENT 1, TO 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 375

November 4, 2003 - Offered by Senator Carpenter.

At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 2, line 1: before that line insert:

"Section 1g. 23.33 (6m) of the statutes is created to read:

23.33 (6m) Accidents; duty upon striking person or attended or occupied vehicle. (a) The operator of any all-terrain vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person or in damage to a vehicle which is driven or attended by any person shall immediately stop such all-terrain vehicle at the scene of the accident or as close thereto as possible but shall then forthwith return to and in every event shall remain at the scene of the accident until the operator has fulfilled the following requirements:

1. The operator of the all-terrain vehicle shall give his or her name, address, and the registration number of the all-terrain vehicle he or she is operating to the

person struck or to the operator or occupant of or person attending any vehicle collided with.

- 2. The operator of the all-terrain vehicle shall render to any person injured in the accident reasonable assistance, including the carrying, or the making of arrangements for the carrying, of such person to a physician, surgeon, or hospital for medical or surgical treatment if it is apparent that such treatment is necessary or if such carrying is requested by the injured person.
- (b) Any stop required under par. (a) shall be made without obstructing traffic more than is necessary.

SECTION 1m. 23.33 (7) (title) of the statutes is amended to read:

23.33 (7) (title) Accidents: <u>Reporting</u>.

Section 1q. 23.33 (13) (cj) of the statutes is created to read:

- 23.33 (13) (cj) Penalties related to leaving the scene of an accident. Any person who violates sub. (6m) (a):
 - (a) Shall be fined not less than \$300 nor more than \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than 6 months or both if the accident did not involve death or injury to a person.
 - (b) May be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned for not more than 9 months or both if the accident involved injury to a person but the person did not suffer great bodily harm.
 - (c) Is guilty of a Class E felony if the accident involved injury to a person and the person suffered great bodily harm.
 - (d) Is guilty of a Class D felony if the accident involved death to a person.
 - (e) Is guilty of a felony if the accident involved death or injury to a person.".
 - 2. Page 2, line 1: delete "Section 1" and substitute "Section 1t".

3. Page 2, line 8: after that line insert:

The operator of the snowmobile shall render to any person injured in the accident reasonable assistance, including the carrying, or the making of arrangements for the carrying, of such person to a physician, surgeon, or hospital for medical or surgical treatment if it is apparent that such treatment is necessary or if such carrying is requested by the injured person.
- (b) Any stop required under par. (a) shall be made without obstructing traffic more than is necessary.".
