ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 33, TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 100

June 21, 2005 - Offered by Representative COLON.

1	At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:
2	1. Page 164, line 20: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2005–06 by
3	\$194,900 and increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2006–07 by \$609,700 to
4	increase funding for an increase in foster care rates.
5	${f 2.}$ Page 166, line 21: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2005–06 by
6	\$83,900 and increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2006-07 by \$220,000 to
7	increase funding for an increase in foster care rates.
8	3. Page 465, line 11: delete lines 11 to 24.
9	4. Page 466, line 1: delete lines 1 and 2 and substitute:
10	"SECTION 951g. 48.62 (4) of the statutes is amended to read:
11	48.62 (4) Monthly payments in foster care shall be provided according to the
12	age-related rates specified in this subsection. Beginning on January 1, 2000, the

1	age-related rates are: \$299 for children aged 4 and under; \$326 for children aged 5
T	age related rates are. \$255 for enharch aged 7 and under, \$526 for enharch aged 5
2	to 11; \$371 for children aged 12 to 14 and \$387 for children aged 15 to 17. Beginning
3	on January 1, 2001, the age–related rates are: \$302 for children aged 4 and under;
4	\$329 for children aged 5 to 11; \$375 for children aged 12 to 14; and \$391 for children
5	aged 15 to 17 2006, the age-related rates are \$317 for a child under 5 years of age;
6	<u>\$345 for a child 5 to 11 years of age; \$394 for a child 12 to 14 years of age; and \$411</u>
7	for a child 15 years of age or over. Beginning on January 1, 2007, the age- related
8	rates are to \$332 for a child under five years of age; \$362 for a child 5 to 11 years of
9	age; \$413 for a child 12 to 14 years of age; and \$430 for a child 15 years of age or over.
10	In addition to these grants for basic maintenance, the department shall make
11	supplemental payments for special needs, exceptional circumstances, care in a
12	treatment foster home, and initial clothing allowances according to rules
13	promulgated by the department.".
