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## ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1, TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 318

May 12, 2005 - Offered by Representative Loeffelholz.

At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 1, line 5: delete "has" and substitute "means a person who is verified by the department of veterans affairs as being a resident of this state for purposes of receiving benefits under ch. 45, as being a resident at the time of his or her entry into the U.S. armed forces or forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces, and as meeting any of the following conditions:
- 1. The person has served on active duty for at least one qualifying term of service under subds. 2. to 4. under honorable conditions in the U.S. armed forces or in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces during a war period or in a crisis zone.
- 2. The person has served on active duty in the U.S. armed forces or in forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces under honorable conditions, for 2 continuous

- years or more or for the full period of his or her initial service obligation, whichever is less.
  - 3. The person has served on active duty for 90 days or more under honorable conditions in the U.S. armed forces or in forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces during a war period or for any period of service under section 1 of executive order 10957 dated August 10, 1961.
  - 4. The term of service in the U.S. armed forces or in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces under honorable conditions entitled the person to receive the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, established by executive order 10977 on December 4, 1961, the Vietnam Service Medal established by executive order 11231 on July 8, 1965, the Navy Expeditionary Medal, the Marine Corps Expeditionary Medal, or an equivalent expeditionary or service medal.
  - 5. The person was honorably discharged from the U.S. armed forces or from forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces for a service-connected disability, for a disability subsequently adjudicated to have been service connected, or for reasons of hardship.
  - 6. The person was released under honorable conditions from the U.S. armed forces or from forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces due to a reduction in the U.S. armed forces.".
    - **2.** Page 1, line 6: delete that line.
    - **3.** Page 2, line 1: after "to" insert "100 percent of nonresident tuition and".
- 4. Page 2, line 3: delete "resident".
  - **5.** Page 2, line 3: after that line insert:
- 24 "Section 1v. 38.22 (6) (e) of the statutes is created to read:

- 38.22 **(6)** (e) Any person verified by the department of veterans affairs as being a resident of this state under s. 38.24 (8) (a).".
- **6.** Page 2, line 5: delete "has the" and substitute "means a person who is verified by the department of veterans affairs as being a resident of this state for purposes of receiving benefits under ch. 45, as being a resident at the time of his or her entry into the U.S. armed forces or forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces, and as meeting any of the following conditions:
- 1. The person has served on active duty for at least one qualifying term of service under subds. 2. to 4. under honorable conditions in the U.S. armed forces or in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces during a war period or in a crisis zone.

- 4. The term of service in the U.S. armed forces or in forces incorporated as part of the U.S. armed forces under honorable conditions entitled the person to receive the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, established by executive order 10977 on December 4, 1961, the Vietnam Service Medal established by executive order 11231

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- on July 8, 1965, the Navy Expeditionary Medal, the Marine Corps Expeditionary

  Medal, or an equivalent expeditionary or service medal.
  - 5. The person was honorably discharged from the U.S. armed forces or from forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces for a service-connected disability, for a disability subsequently adjudicated to have been service connected, or for reasons of hardship.
  - 6. The person was released under honorable conditions from the U.S. armed forces or from forces incorporated in the U.S. armed forces due to a reduction in the U.S. armed forces.".
    - **7.** Page 2, line 6: delete that line.
      - **8.** Page 2, line 9: delete "resident".
  - **9.** Page 2, line 9: after that line insert:
- "Section 2m. 45.35 (14) (j) of the statutes is created to read:
- 45.35 **(14)** (j) To provide verification to the educational institution of the information required under s. 36.27 (30) (a) or 38.24 (8) (a).".
