## SENATE AMENDMENT 11, TO 2011 ASSEMBLY BILL 7

 $May \ 17, \ 2011 \ - \ Offered \ by \ Senators \ S. \ Coggs, \ Risser, \ Miller, \ Vinehout, \ Erpenbach and \ Taylor.$ 

1	At the locations indicated, amend the bill, as shown by assembly substitute
2	amendment 2, as follows:
3	<b>1.</b> Page 65, line 15: after that line insert:
4	<b>"SECTION 116g.</b> 343.16 (3) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:
5	343.16 (3) (a) The department shall examine every applicant for the renewal
6	of an operator's license once every 8 years. The department may institute a method
7	of selecting the date of renewal so that such examination shall be required for each
8	applicant for renewal of a license to gain a uniform rate of examinations. The
9	examination shall consist of a test of eyesight. The department shall make
10	provisions for giving such examinations at examining stations in each county to all
11	applicants for an operator's license. <u>At least one examining station in each county</u>
12	shall be open for business on each weekday except that, in any county with a
13	geographic area of at least 500 square miles, at least 2 examining stations in the

county shall be open for business on each weekday. The person to be examined shall 1  $\mathbf{2}$ appear at the examining station nearest the person's place of residence or at such 3 time and place as the department designates in answer to an applicant's request. In 4 lieu of examination, the applicant may present or mail to the department a report 5 of examination of the applicant's evesight by an ophthalmologist, optometrist, or physician licensed to practice medicine. The report shall be based on an examination 6 7 made not more than 3 months prior to the date it is submitted. The report shall be 8 on a form furnished and in the form required by the department. The department 9 shall decide whether, in each case, the evesight reported is sufficient to meet the 10 current eyesight standards.

**SECTION 116h.** 343.16 (3) (a) of the statutes, as affected by 2007 Wisconsin Act 20 and 2011 Wisconsin Act .... (this act), is repealed and recreated to read:

13 343.16 (3) (a) Except as provided in s. 343.165 (4) (d), the department shall 14examine every applicant for the renewal of an operator's license once every 8 years. 15The department may institute a method of selecting the date of renewal so that such examination shall be required for each applicant for renewal of a license to gain a 16 17uniform rate of examinations. The examination shall consist of a test of evesight. 18 The department shall make provisions for giving such examinations at examining stations in each county to all applicants for an operator's license. At least one 19 20 examining station in each county shall be open for business on each weekday except 21that, in any county with a geographic area of at least 500 square miles, at least 2 22examining stations in the county shall be open for business on each weekday. The 23person to be examined shall appear at the examining station nearest the person's  $\mathbf{24}$ place of residence or at such time and place as the department designates in answer to an applicant's request. In lieu of examination, the applicant may present or mail 25

1	to the department a report of examination of the applicant's eyesight by an
2	ophthalmologist, optometrist, or physician licensed to practice medicine. The report
3	shall be based on an examination made not more than 3 months prior to the date it
4	is submitted. The report shall be on a form furnished and in the form required by
5	the department. The department shall decide whether, in each case, the eyesight
6	reported is sufficient to meet the current eyesight standards.".
7	<b>2.</b> Page 78, line 10: after "sections" insert "343.16 (3) (a),".
8	<b>3.</b> Page 78, line 10: delete "(5)" and substitute "(5),".
