# ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 7, TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO ASSEMBLY BILL 389 

October 15, 2013 - Offered by Representatives Tittl and Spiros.

At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

1. Page 2 , line 12 : delete the material beginning with that line and ending with page 3 , line 2 , and substitute:
"Section 3c. 346.57 (4) (gm) of the statutes is renumbered 346.57 (4) (gm) (intro.) and amended to read:
346.57 (4) (gm) (intro.) Sixty-five miles per hour on On any freeway or expressway: that is not a part of the national system of interstate and defense highways, 65 miles per hour, and on any freeway or expressway that is a part of the national system of interstate and defense highways, the following:

Section 3d. 346.57 (4) (gm) 1. and 2. of the statutes are created to read:
346.57 (4) (gm) 1. If the department has determined under s. 349.11 (8) (c) 2. that a differential speed limit would improve safety on freeways or expressways and
has established a maximum speed limit of 65 miles per hour for vehicles under this subdivision, 65 miles per hour for a commercial motor vehicle, except a motor bus, having a gross weight of more than 26,000 pounds.
2. Seventy miles per hour unless subd. 1. applies.".
2. Page 3, line 2: after that line insert:
"SECTION 3g. 349.11 (8) (c) of the statutes is renumbered 349.11 (8) (c) 1. and amended to read:
349.11 (8) (c) 1. Maximum Except as provided in subd. 2., maximum speed limits which are not uniformly applicable to all types of motor vehicles using a highway, except that a lower speed limit may be established for any vehicle operating under a special permit because of any weight or dimension of such vehicle.

SECTION 3r. 349.11 (8) (c) 2. of the statutes is created to read:
349.11 (8) (c) 2. Not later than the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective date of this subdivision .... [LRB inserts date], the department shall submit to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature, as determined by the speaker of the assembly and the president of the senate, a report on the safety and suitability of a 65-mile-per-hour speed limit for commercial motor vehicles, except motor buses, having a gross weight of more than 26,000 pounds on a freeway or expressway upon which other vehicles are subject to a speed limit of 70 miles per hour. If the department determines that a differential speed limit would improve safety on the freeways or expressways, the department may establish under s . 346.57 (4) (gm) maximum speed limits on a freeway or expressway that is a part of
the national system of interstate and defense highways that are not uniformly applicable to all types of motor vehicles using the highway.".
