SENATE AMENDMENT 14, TO ASSEMBLY BILL 40

June 20, 2013 – Offered by Senators Carpenter, Hansen, Wirch, Risser, T. Cullen, Miller, Lehman, Harris, Vinehout, L. Taylor, Erpenbach, Lassa, C. Larson and Shilling.

1	At the locations indicated, amend the bill, as shown by assembly substitute
2	amendment 1, as follows:
3	1. Page 213, line 17: decrease the dollar amount for fiscal year 2014–15 by
4	\$3,974,700 for the purpose of expanding the Family Care program and the
5	self-directed services option to Brown, Door, Kewaunee, Marinette, Menominee,
6	Oconto, Shawano, and Waushara counties.
7	2. Page 221, line 23: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2014–15 by
8	\$866,500 for the purpose of paying moneys to counties and American Indian tribes
9	that have reductions in the amount of federal moneys received from grants under
10	title III of the Older Americans Act.
11	3. Page 1287, line 21: after "Act." insert "In the 2014–15 fiscal year, the
12	department of health services shall pay to each county and tribe that had a reduction
13	an amount equal to the amount the federal moneys are reduced between calendar

years 2012 and 2013 to be used for the same purposes as federal moneys provided
 under title III of the Older Americans Act.".
 4. Page 1287, line 22: delete the material beginning with that line and ending

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- 4 with page 1288, line 13, and substitute:
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"(3e) FAMILY CARE EXPANSION TO NORTHEASTERN COUNTIES.

6 (a) The department of health services shall do all of the following for residents
7 of any of the counties of Brown, Door, Kewaunee, Marinette, Menominee, Oconto,
8 Shawano, and Waushara that have complied with the applicable statutory
9 requirements:

- Contract with an entity to provide the services under section 46.283 of the
 statutes as a resource center such that services of a resource center are available to
 residents before July 1, 2014.
- 2. Contract with an entity as provided under section 46.284 (2) of the statutes
 to administer the Family Care benefit as a care management organization such that
 the family care benefit is available to residents on July 1, 2014.
- 3. Provide services under the self-directed services option, known as IRIS, that
 is operated under a waiver from the secretary of the federal department of health and
 human services under 42 USC 1396n (c) such that the services are available to
 residents on July 1, 2014.
- (b) Notwithstanding section 46.281 (1g) (b) of the statutes, the department of
 health services is not required to obtain approval from the joint committee on finance
 to enter contracts or provide services as described in paragraph (a).".
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
