SENATE AMENDMENT 3, TO SENATE BILL 589

March 11, 2014 – Offered by Senator VINEHOUT.

1	At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:
2	${f 1.}$ Page 1, line 8: delete "year" and substitute "year, the awarding of academic
3	excellence higher education scholarships to pupils of public and tribal high schools
4	with enrollments of at least 20 but fewer than 80 pupils,".
5	2. Page 2, line 1: delete that line and substitute:
6	"SECTION 1b. 39.41 (1m) (a) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:
7	39.41 (1m) (a) 1. For each <u>public or tribal</u> high school with an enrollment of at
8	least 80 <u>20</u> pupils but less than 500 pupils <u>and for each private high school with an</u>
9	enrollment of at least 80 pupils but less than 500 pupils, designate the senior with
10	the highest grade point average in all subjects as a scholar.
11	SECTION 1d. 39.41 (1m) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:
12	39.41 (1m) (b) Subject to par. (e), by February 25 of each school year, the school
13	board of each school district operating one or more high schools and the governing

body of each private high school and of each tribal high school may, for each high
school with an enrollment of less than 80 20 pupils, may nominate the senior with
the highest grade point average in all subjects who may be designated as a scholar
by the executive secretary under par. (c) 3.

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SECTION 1f. 39.41 (1m) (c) 4. of the statutes is amended to read:

6 39.41 (1m) (c) 4. For each public, private, or tribal high school with an 7 enrollment of at least 80 20 pupils and for each private high school with an 8 enrollment of at least 80 pupils, notify the school board of the school district 9 operating the public high school or the governing body of the private or tribal high 10 school of the number of scholars to be designated under par. (a).

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SECTION 1h. 39.41 (1m) (c) 5. of the statutes is amended to read:

12 39.41 (1m) (c) 5. For each public, private, or tribal high school with an 13 enrollment of less than 80 20 pupils and for each private high school with an 14 enrollment of less than 80 pupils, notify the school board of the school district 15 operating the public high school or the governing body of the private or tribal high 16 school that the school board or governing body may nominate a senior under par. (b) 17 who may be designated as a scholar by the executive secretary.

18 **SECTION 1j.** 39.41 (1m) (d) of the statutes is amended to read:

19 39.41 (1m) (d) By February 25 of each school year, if 2 or more seniors from the 20 same <u>public or tribal</u> high school of at least 80 <u>20</u> pupils <u>or from the same private high</u> 21 <u>school of at least 80 pupils</u> have the same grade point average and, except for the 22 limitation on the number of designated scholars, are otherwise eligible for 23 designation under par. (a), the faculty of the high school shall select the applicable 24 number of seniors for designation under par. (a) as scholars and shall certify, in order 25 of priority, any remaining seniors with the same grade point average as alternates 2013 – 2014 Legislature

1 for the scholars or, if there is no remaining senior with the same grade point average, 2 any remaining seniors with the next highest grade point average, but not less than 3 3.800 or the equivalent, as alternates for the scholars. If a senior from that high 4 school designated as a scholar under par. (a) does not qualify for a higher education 5 scholarship under sub. (2) (a) or (3) (a), an alternate for the scholar with the same 6 grade point average as any senior from that high school designated as a scholar 7 under par. (a) shall be eligible for a higher education scholarship as a scholar under 8 sub. (2) (a) or (3) (a) until the scholarship may be awarded by the board. If an 9 alternate with the same grade point average as a scholar under par. (a) does not 10 qualify for a higher education scholarship under sub. (2) (a) or (3) (a), an alternate 11 with the next highest grade point average, but not less than 3.800 or the equivalent, 12shall be eligible for a higher education scholarship as a scholar under sub. (2) (a) or 13 (3) (a) until the scholarship may be awarded by the board.

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SECTION 1k. 39.41 (1m) (e) of the statutes is amended to read:

1539.41 (1m) (e) If 2 or more seniors from the same public or tribal high school 16 of less than 80 20 pupils or from the same private high school of less than 80 pupils 17have the same grade point average and, except for the limitation of one nominated 18 senior, are otherwise eligible for nomination under par. (b), the faculty of the high 19 school shall select the senior who may be nominated by the school board of the school 20 district operating the public high school or the governing body of the private or tribal 21high school for designation under par. (b) as a scholar by the executive secretary. If 22that senior is designated as a scholar by the executive secretary, but does not qualify 23for a higher education scholarship under sub. (2) (a) or (3) (a), the faculty of the high 24school shall select, in order of priority, one or more of the remaining seniors with the same grade point average for certification as a scholar or, if there is no remaining 25

senior with the same grade point average, one or more of the remaining seniors with
the next highest grade point average, but not less than 3.800 or the equivalent, for
certification as a scholar, and the school board of the school district operating the
high school or the governing body of the private or tribal high school shall certify to
the board one or more of these seniors as eligible for a higher education scholarship
as a scholar under sub. (2) (a) or (3) (a) until the scholarship may be awarded by the
board.

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SECTION 1m. 39.41 (1m) (g) of the statutes is amended to read:

9 39.41 (1m) (g) Notwithstanding par. (a), if a public or tribal high school of at 10 least 80 20 pupils or a private high school of at least 80 pupils closes or merges in the 11 1991–92 school year or in any school year thereafter, the school board of the school 12district operating the high school or the governing body of the private or tribal high 13school shall, subject to par. (d), for each of the 2 school years following the closure or 14merger, designate the same number of scholars from among the pupils enrolled in 15the high school at the time of closure or merger as the number of scholars designated 16 for that high school in the school year the high school closed or merged. Any seniors 17designated under this paragraph shall be eligible for an original scholarship under 18 this section.

19 SECTION 1n. 39.41 (1m) (h) of the statutes is repealed.

20 **SECTION 1p.** 39.41 (1m) (j) of the statutes is amended to read:

39.41 (1m) (j) In the event that If 2 or more seniors from the same <u>public or</u>
<u>tribal</u> high school of at least 80 <u>20</u> pupils, or from the same private high school of at
<u>least 80 pupils</u>, have the same grade point average and are otherwise eligible for
designation under par. (a), the school board of the school district operating the high

1 school or the governing body of the private or tribal high school shall make the $\mathbf{2}$ designation of the faculty of the high school for purposes of par. (d) or (i). **SECTION 1r.** 39.41 (1m) (m) of the statutes is amended to read: 3 4 39.41 (1m) (m) Notwithstanding pars. (a), (b) and (d), if a high school ranks its 5 seniors on the basis of grades in academic subjects, the school board of the school 6 district operating the high school or the governing body of the private or tribal high 7 school or, for purposes of par. (d), the faculty of the high school may request a waiver 8 from the executive secretary in order to fulfill its requirements under par. Notwithstanding section 39.41 (1m) (a) (intro.) and (d) of the 15statutes, by May 1, 2014, the school board of a school district operating a public high 16 school with an enrollment of at least 20 pupils but less than 80 pupils or the 17governing body of a tribal high school with an enrollment of at least 20 pupils but less 18 than 80 pupils may designate the senior with the highest grade point average in all 19 subjects as an academic excellence higher education scholar and that scholar shall 20 be eligible for an academic excellence higher education scholarship in the 2014–15 21academic year. This subsection does not apply to a school board or a governing body 22of a tribal high school that nominated a senior as an academic excellence higher 23education scholar under section 39.41 (1m) (b) of the statutes by February 25, 2014, 24if that senior was subsequently designated as such a scholar by the executive

secretary of the higher education aids board under section 39.41 (1m) (c) 3. of the
 statutes.".

5 (1) ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS. The treatment of
6 section 39.41 (1m) (a) 1., (b), (c) 4. and 5., (d), (e), (g), (h), (j), and (m) of the statutes
7 takes effect retroactively to January 1, 2014.".
