 - 3. "If the city of Milwaukee issues, or expends funds for the issuance of, a photo identification card for any resident of the city, may the photo identification card be used by the resident to obtain public assistance benefits?"
 - (b) All of the following apply:
 - 1. A majority of those voting on the question under par. (a) 1. reject the question.
 - 2. A majority of those voting on the question under par. (a) 2. reject the question.

3. A majority of those voting on the question under par. (a) 3. reject the question.".
