2. A person who was admitted into the United States as a refugee from Laos

under 8 USC 1157 and served with a special guerilla unit, or irregular forces,

At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

operating from a base in Laos in support of the U.S. military during the period beginning February 28, 1961, and ending September 18, 1978.

Section 2m. 343.14 (2) (j) of the statutes is amended to read:

343.14 (2) (j) A statement as to whether the applicant is a veteran, as defined in s. 45.01 (12) (k), and, if so, whether the applicant wishes to have his or her veteran status indicated on the license or identification card. If the applicant has indicated that he or she is a veteran and wishes to have his or her veteran status indicated on the license or identification card, the applicant shall provide verification from the department of veterans affairs or a county veterans service officer that the applicant is a veteran. If the applicant is a veteran, as defined in s. 45.01 (12) (k) 2., the applicant shall provide documentation of the applicant's service with a special guerilla unit or irregular forces as provided under section 4 of the federal Hmong Veterans' Naturalization Act of 2000, P.L. 106–207.".
