- 9 120.12 (22m) CLINICALLY TRAINED MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL; SERVICES.

 10 Adopt a policy on pupil access to services provided by an individual who holds a

 11 clinically trained mental health professional license issued by the department. A

school board shall include in a policy under this subsection at least all of the following:

- (a) Before a pupil obtains services, the school board shall notify the pupil's parent or guardian that a clinically trained mental health professional provides services to pupils in the school district. The notice shall include a description of the clinically trained mental health professional's scope of practice.
- (b) A requirement that the parent or guardian consent to the pupil obtaining services from a clinically trained mental health professional.
- (c) An agreement between the pupil's parent or guardian, the pupil's school, and the clinically trained mental health professional who will provide services to the pupil that clearly states the extent to which the parent or guardian may access information and records related to services provided to the pupil. Unless the parties agree otherwise, the clinically trained mental health professional shall agree to provide the pupil's parent or guardian with the most access allowed under state and federal law, including providing the parent or guardian with information related to providing a referral to the pupil for a health care provider.
- (d) An opportunity for an adult pupil or the parent or guardian of a minor pupil to opt out of the policy.

SECTION 1m. MPSW 20.02 (32) of the administrative code is created to read: MPSW 20.02 (32) Violating an agreement with a school and a pupil's parent or guardian under s. 120.12 (22m).".
