ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO ASSEMBLY BILL 274

October 16, 2023 - Offered by Representative PRONSCHINSKE.

1 AN ACT to repeal 20.445 (1) (bk) and 106.276; to amend 20.445 (1) (bm); and to

2 *create* 20.445 (1) (bk) and 106.276 of the statutes; **relating to:** a commercial

3 driver training grant program.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This substitute amendment differs from 2023 Assembly Bill 274 in the following respects:

1. The substitute amendment provides that, in order to qualify for a grant for providing training leading to an individual receiving a commercial driver's license (CDL), the following additional requirements must be satisfied:

a. The individual receiving the training must reside and obtain a CDL in this state.

b. The grant applicant must have a facility in this state that is listed in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's registry of approved training providers, and the training must be provided at or through that facility.

2. The substitute amendment removes the appropriation of funds to the Joint Committee on Finance.

3. The substitute amendment repeals the provisions for the grant program on July 1, 2025, which is the date by which grant applications must be received.

10	SECTION 3. 20.445 (1) (bk) of the statutes, as created by 2023 Wisconsin Act
11	(this act), is repealed.

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3 SECTION 5. 20.445 (1) (bm) of the statutes, as affected by 2023 Wisconsin Act
4 (this act), is amended to read:

20.445 (1) (bm) Workforce training; administration. Biennially, the amounts 5 6 in the schedule for the administration of the local youth apprenticeship grant 7 program under s. 106.13 (3m), the youth summer jobs program under s. 106.18, the 8 employment transit assistance grant program under s. 106.26, the workforce 9 training program under s. 106.27, the teacher development program grants under 10 s. 106.272, the career and technical education incentive grant program under s. 11 106.273, the technical education equipment grant program under s. 106.275, the 12 commercial driver training grant program under s. 106.276, and the apprentice programs under subch. 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SECTION 6. 106.276 of the statutes is created to read:

15 106.276 Commercial driver training grant program. (1) (a) The
 16 department shall establish and administer a commercial driver training grant
 17 program.

(b) A person that satisfies the eligibility requirements under par. (c) may apply
to the department for a grant under this section. The department shall prescribe the
form, nature, and extent of information that shall be contained in applications for
grants under this section.

(c) An applicant is eligible for a grant under this section if all of the followingare satisfied:

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1	1. The applicant provides to an individual who resides in this state training in
2	the operation of commercial motor vehicles that satisfies the requirements of 49 CFR
3	part 380, subparts F and G.
4	2. The applicant is listed on the Training Provider Registry (TPR), as set forth
5	in 49 CFR part 380, subpart G.
6	2m. The applicant has a facility in this state that is listed in the Training
7	Provider Registry described in subd. 2., and the training described in subd. 1. is
8	provided at or through that facility.
9	3. The individual for whom the applicant provides training under subd. 1.
10	obtains an initial commercial driver license, as defined in s. 340.01 (7m), in this state
11	after the effective date of this subdivision [LRB inserts date].
12	4. The application is received by the department before July 1, 2025.
13	(d) From the appropriation under s. 20.445 (1) (bk), the department may award
14	grants to eligible applicants under par. (c). The amount of a grant under this section
15	with regard to each individual trained may not exceed 50 percent of the costs of
16	training the individual in the operation of commercial motor vehicles or \$3,000,
17	whichever is less.
18	(2) Before July 1 of each year, the department shall prepare a report
19	summarizing the number and amount of grants awarded under sub. (1). The
20	department shall submit the report to the appropriate standing committees of the
21	legislature under s. 13.172 (3).
22	SECTION 7. 106.276 of the statutes, as created by 2023 Wisconsin Act \dots (this
23	act), is repealed.
24	SECTION 8. Effective dates. This act takes effect on the day after publication,
25	except as follows:

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- (1) The treatment of s. 20.445 (1) (bm) (by SECTION 5) and the repeal of ss. 20.445
 (1) (bk) and 106.276 take effect July 1, 2025.
