GENERAL STATE GOVERNMENT

Procurement and risk management educational services

This bill authorizes DOA to provide educational services in procurement and risk management to local governmental units and private entities. The bill requires DOA to charge fees for its services. The bill also creates an appropriation for fees received from local governmental units and private entities for technical assistance services provided by the office of sustainability and clean energy.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 16.004 (25) of the statutes is created to read:

16.004 (25) PROCUREMENT AND RISK MANAGEMENT EDUCATIONAL SERVICES. The

department may provide educational services regarding procurement and risk

management, including seminars, courses, or conferences, to local governmental units, as defined in s. 16.97 (7), and private organizations. The department shall charge and collect fees sufficient to recover the costs of activities authorized under this subsection.

SECTION 2. 20.505 (1) (h) of the statutes is created to read:

20.505 (1) (h) Procurement and risk management services and technical assistance. All moneys received under s. 16.004 (25) from local governmental units and private organizations for services relating to procurement and risk management, for the purposes for which received, and all moneys received under s. 16.954 (5) (a) from local governmental units and private organizations for technical assistance services provided by the office of sustainability and clean energy.
