The Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations proposes an order to create ILHR 83.035, relating to petitions for variance and private sewage systems.

#### ANALYSIS OF RULES

Statutory authority: ss. 101.02 (1), 101.02 (6) (e), and 145.02 (2), Stats. Statutes interpreted: s. 145.02 (1) and 145.13, Stats.

Currently the rules of chapter ILHR 3 delineate the procedures for petitions of variance to rules administered and enforced by the Division of Safety and Buildings, Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations. In light of a recent court action, the Division of Safety and Buildings has determined to specifically indicate that the rules of ch. ILHR 83 pertaining to the design, installation and maintenance of private sewage systems may be petitioned in accordance with ch. ILHR 3. The proposed rule is intended to clarify that petitions for variance may be requested for the design or installation of new private sewage systems.

SECTION 1. ILHR 83.035 is create to read:

ILHR 83.035 PETITIONS FOR VARIANCE. The department shall consider a petition for a variance to a rule of this chapter in accordance with ch. ILHR 3. The department shall grant a variance provided an equivalency to the intent of the specific rule can be established.

Note: The department cannot grant a petition for an issue which is also specifically covered by the statutes; for example, a petition to waive the requirement to obtain a sanitary permit to install a new private sewage system.
