

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD AMENDING RULES

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board proposes an order to amend NR 20.03(1)(k), related to the daily bag limit for panfish as it applies to recreational fishing on inland waters.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.174 and 227.11(2)(a), Stats. Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.085 and 29.174(2)(a), Stats.

This order reduces the daily bag limit for panfish in most inland waters of the state from 50 to 25 in total.

SECTION 1. NR 20.03(1)(k), as affected by Clearinghouse rule number 96-023, is amended to read:

4. In all urban waters of Kenosha, Racine, Walworth, Milwaukee, Waukesha, Washington, Ozaukee and Sheboygan counties	Continuous	10 in total No size limit with bullheads
5. Lake Wazee, Jackson county; Newman lake, Price county	Continuous	10 in total No size limit
6. Turtle-Flambeau flowage, Iron county	Continuous	10 in total 10 for crappie; no size limit for other species
