were temporarily suspended on April 9, 2020, under the Governor's Emergency Order #23, which remained in effect for		
the duration of the public health emergency declared in Executive Order #72. The proposed emergency rules will enable		
the Department to extend the amendments beyond the expiration of the Governor's emergency authority.
