## EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 15

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of State Senator from the 2nd Senate District because of the resignation of Thomas E. Petri; in the office of State Representative from he 10th Assembly District because of the resignation of Rod Johnston; and, in the office of State Representative from the 60th Assembly District because of the resignation of David W. Opitz, each of whose term of office would have expired on the first Monday in January, 1981;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEE SHERMAN DREYFUS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 8.50, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, do hereby order that, to fill the three existing vacancies, Special Elections be held on July 10, 1979

- in the 2nd Senate District, consisting of all or part of Brown, Calumet, Outagamie, Fond du Lac, Sheboygan, and Washington Counties;
- in the 10th Assembly District, consisting of a portion of Milwaukee County; and,
- in the 60th Assembly District, consisting of portions of Ozaukee and Sheboygan Counties,

each as described in Section 4.06(1), Wisconsin Statutes.

AND, the circulation of nominating papers for partisan and independent candidates may commence on May 2, 1979; the deadline for filing nomination papers for partisan and independent candidates shall be 5:00 p.m., May 22, 1979. The Special Primaries shall be held on June 12, 1979, and the Special Elections shall be held July 10, 1979. Each shall be noticed, held, conducted, canvassed, and returned in accordance with law.
