EXECUTIVE ORDER #33

Relating to Establishing the Governor's State Housing Task Force.


WHEREAS, affordable and quality housing is not only essential to the quality of life for Wisconsin's citizens, but is also of great social and economic importance to this state; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin state government should maintain a comprehensive housing policy which furthers the maintenance of affordable and quality housing;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 14.019, do hereby:

1. Establish the Governor's State Housing Task Force.
2. Provide that the membership of the Task Force consist of twelve members appointed by the Governor, to serve at his pleasure. The Executive Director of the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA) shall serve as Chairman of the Task Force. The remaining members shall include representatives of housing groups, private industry and governmental agencies.
3. Provide that the Task Force (a) prepare a review of Wisconsin's housing market, (b) identify the strengths and weaknesses of Wisconsin's housing market, (c) determine overall trends impacting upon Wisconsin's housing market, (d) identify the major housing issues in Wisconsin, and (e) develop policy recommendations that address housing issues in Wisconsin.
4. Provide that a final report from the Task Force be delivered to the Governor no later than October 1, 1988.
5. Provide that staff support for the Task Force be provided by WHEDA with the expenses of the members of the Task Force paid by WHEDA.
