EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 347


Relating to a Proclamation that the Flags of the United States and the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for those Individuals Killed in the Bombing Incidents Outside the United States Embassies in Nairobi, Kenya and Dar es Salaam, Tanzania

WHEREAS, terrorist bombs exploded outside the United States Embassies in Nairobi, Kenya and Dar es Salaam, Tanzania at approximately 2:30 AM CDT on August 7, 1998; and

WHEREAS, more than 50 people were killed and more than 1000 people were injured by these cowardly acts of terrorism; and

WHEREAS, President Clinton has ordered that the flag of the United States shall be flown at half-staff until sundown on Sunday, August 9, 1998 as a mark of respect for those killed in these terrible events;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, DO HEREBY ORDER that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning forthwith until sundown on Sunday, August 9, 1998.



IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this eighth day of August in the year one thousand nine hundred and ninety-eight.
