

EXECUTIVE ORDER # 32


Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Sergeant Warren S. Hansen of the United States Army Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2003, a helicopter crash occurred in Iraq killing Sergeant Warren S. Hansen of Clintonville, Wisconsin, a member of the 9th Battalion, 101st Aviation Regiment, 101st Airborne Division; and


WHEREAS, Sergeant Warren S. Hansen faithfully and honorably served the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Sergeant Warren S. Hansen in this tragic accident;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on Saturday, November 29, 2003 and ending at sundown on that date.
