EXECUTIVE ORDER # 41

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Captain John F. Kurth of the United States Army Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2004, Captain John F. Kurth of Columbus, Wisconsin, a member of the United States Army, 1st Infantry Division's 1st Battalion, 18th Infantry Regiment, was killed in a bomb explosion in Tikrit, Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Captain John F. Kurth provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Captain John F. Kurth; and

WHEREAS, Captain John F. Kurth will be laid to rest on Saturday, March 27, 2004;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Saturday, March 27, 2004** and ending at sunset on that date.
