Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Private First Class Gregory R. Goodrich of the United States Army Reserve Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


**WHEREAS**, on April 9, 2004, Private First Class Gregory R. Goodrich, a member of the United States Army Reserves, 724<sup>th</sup> Transportation Company, was killed when his convoy came under attack in Iraq; and

**WHEREAS**, Private First Class Gregory R. Goodrich provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


**WHEREAS**, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Private First Class Gregory R. Goodrich; and

**WHEREAS**, Private First Class Gregory R. Goodrich will be laid to rest in Wisconsin on Monday, April 19, 2004;


**NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Monday, April 19, 2004**, and ending at sunset on that date.
