EXECUTIVE ORDER # 48

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Specialist Michael A. McGlothlin of the United States Army Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

**WHEREAS**, on April 17, 2004, Specialist Michael A. McGlothlin, of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, a member of the United States Army, 115<sup>th</sup> Forward Support Battalion, Division Support Command, 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division, was killed when an explosive device exploded near his patrol in Baghdad, Iraq; and

**WHEREAS**, Specialist Michael A. McGlothlin provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Specialist Michael A. McGlothlin; and

**WHEREAS**, Specialist Michael A. McGlothlin will be laid to rest in Wisconsin on Tuesday, April 27, 2004;


**NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on Tuesday, April 27, 2004, and ending at sunset on that date.
