

EXECUTIVE ORDER # 55


Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for the Late Ronald Reagan, Former President of the United States

WHEREAS, on June 5, 2004, Former President Ronald Reagan passed away at the age of ninety-three; and

WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan served as the fortieth President of the United States from 1981 to 1989; and

WHEREAS, Federal law at 4 U.S.C. § 7(m) provides that the flag of the United States shall be flown at half-staff for thirty days following the death of a former President of the United States;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning forthwith until sunset on Monday, July 5, 2004.
