EXECUTIVE ORDER # 71

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Private First Class Andrew McFall Halverson of the United States Marines Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on October 9, 2004, Private First Class Andrew McFall Halverson, of Shopiere, Wisconsin, a member of the United States Marines, 2nd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, I Marine Expeditionary Force, was killed during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Private First Class Andrew McFall Halverson provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Private First Class Andrew McFall Halverson; and

WHEREAS, Private First Class Andrew McFall Halverson will be laid to rest on Monday, October 18, 2004;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Monday, October 18, 2004**, and ending at sunset on that date.
