### EXECUTIVE ORDER # 74

**Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Corporal Robert P. Warns II of the United States Marine Corps Reserve Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom**

**WHEREAS**, on November 8, 2004, Corporal Robert Warns II, of Waukesha, Wisconsin, a member of the United States Marine Corps Reserve, Golf Company, 2nd Battalion, 24th Marine Regiment, was killed during enemy action in Iraq; and


**WHEREAS**, Corporal Robert Warns II provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Corporal Robert Warns II; and


**WHEREAS**, Corporal Robert Warns II will be laid to rest on Thursday, November 18, 2004;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Thursday, November 18, 2004**, and ending at sunset on that date.
