EXECUTIVE ORDER # 76

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Lance Corporal Shane K. O'Donnell of the United States Marine Corps Reserve Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2004, Lance Corporal Shane O'Donnell, of DeForest, Wisconsin, a member of the United States Marine Corps Reserve, Golf Company, 2nd Battalion, 24th Marines, was killed during enemy action in Iraq; and


WHEREAS, Lance Corporal Shane O'Donnell provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Lance Corporal Shane O'Donnell; and


WHEREAS, Lance Corporal Shane O'Donnell will be laid to rest on Saturday, November 20, 2004;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Saturday, November 20, 2004**, and ending at sunset on that date.
