EXECUTIVE ORDER # 130

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Sergeant First Class Matthew Kading of the United States Army Reserve Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


WHEREAS, on October 31, 2005, Sergeant First Class Matthew Kading, a member of 983rd Engineer Battalion, United States Army Reserve, died as a result of injuries sustained during enemy action in Iraq on October 19, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant First Class Matthew Kading provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Sergeant First Class Matthew Kading; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant First Class Matthew Kading will be laid to rest on Monday, November 7, 2005;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **November 7, 2005**, and ending at sunset on that date.
