EXECUTIVE ORDER # 96


Relating to a Special Election for the Town of Monticello


WHEREAS, the Town of Monticello failed to hold a spring election on April 5, 2005, thereby creating vacancies in five Town of Monticello elected offices; and

WHEREAS, before these vacancies were created, the office of Town Board Chairperson was held by Allen Kraus, the office of Town Clerk was held by Walter Weber, the office of Town Treasurer was held by Robert Black, the office of Town Supervisor was held by Rick Gill, and a second office of Town Supervisor was held by Robert Woodworth;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doyle, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to section 8.50(4) of the Wisconsin Statutes, order that a special election be held on Tuesday, May 24, 2005 to fill vacancies in the offices of Town Board Chairperson, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, and two Town Supervisors, all for the Town of Monticello. The term for each of these offices shall expire on April 9, 2007. Nominations for these offices have been determined at a duly-held caucus, and the circulation of nomination papers is not applicable. The Type A Notice of Election and Type E Notice regarding absentee voting will be published no later than April 26, 2005. The Type B and Type D Notices will be published no later than May 23, 2005. This election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with law.
