### EXECUTIVE ORDER # 150

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho of the United States Army Reserve Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


**WHEREAS**, on May 5, 2006, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho, a member of 489th Civil Affairs Battalion, United States Army Reserve, was killed during active duty in Iraq; and

**WHEREAS**, Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


**WHEREAS**, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho; and

**WHEREAS**, a funeral service will be held for Staff Sergeant Nathan Vacho on Tuesday, May 16, 2006;


**NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **May 16, 2006**, and ending at sunset on that date.
