EXECUTIVE ORDER # 175

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Captain Rhett Schiller of the United States Army Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


WHEREAS, on November 16, 2006, Captain Rhett Schiller, a member of 5th Squadron, 73rd Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division, United States Army, died as a result of injuries sustained during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Captain Rhett Schiller provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Captain Rhett Schiller; and

WHEREAS, Captain Rhett Schiller will be laid to rest on Tuesday, November 28, 2006;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on November 28, 2006, and ending at sunset on that date.
