EXECUTIVE ORDER # 195

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Staff Sergeant Robert Basham of the Wisconsin Army National Guard Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on April 14, 2007, Staff Sergeant Robert Basham, a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 1st Battalion, 126th Field Artillery Regiment, Wisconsin Army National Guard, lost his life while serving his nation; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Robert Basham provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Staff Sergeant Robert Basham; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Robert Basham will be laid to rest on Thursday, April 26, 2007;


