EXECUTIVE ORDER # 283

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Master Sergeant Brian Naseman of the United States Army Who Lost His Life While Serving his Country in Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on May 21, 2009, Master Sergeant Brian Naseman, a member of the 108th Forward Support Company, attached to the 2nd Battalion, 127th Infantry, 32nd Infantry Brigade Combat Team, Wisconsin Army National Guard, died while serving his country in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Master Sergeant Brian Naseman provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Master Sergeant Brian Naseman; and

WHEREAS, Master Sergeant Brian Naseman will be laid to rest on Saturday, May 30, 2009;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **May 30, 2009**, and ending at sunset on that date.


