EXECUTIVE ORDER #87

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff in the City of Greenfield in Memory of Retired Police Lieutenant Edward S. Kaczkowski

WHEREAS, on October 23, 2012, retired Police Lieutenant Edward S. Kaczkowski died of natural causes at the age of eighty years; and

WHEREAS, Edward Kaczkowski served his country as a member of the United States Marine Corps from 1951 to 1952; and

WHEREAS, Edward Kaczkowski was appointed as one of the original police officers for the City of Greenfield when the department was created in 1962; and

WHEREAS, Edward Kaczkowski faithfully served the City of Greenfield for twenty-four years as a police sergeant and police lieutenant; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held for Edward Kaczkowski on October 27, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the City of Greenfield petitioned the Office of the Governor to approve the lowering of the flags.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by federal and state law, do hereby authorize that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin may be flown at half-staff in the City of Greenfield beginning at sunrise on **Sunday, October 27, 2012**, and ending at sunset on that date.
