EXECUTIVE ORDER #119

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin may be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Lance Corporal Jeremiah M. Collins, Jr. of the United States Marine Corps Who Lost His Life While Serving His Country During Operation Enduring Freedom—Afghanistan

WHEREAS, on October 5, 2013, Lance Corporal Jeremiah M. Collins, Jr., a member of Combat Logistics Regiment 2, 2nd Marine Logistics Group, II Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, United States Marine Corps, died while serving his country in Afghanistan; and

WHEREAS, Lance Corporal Jeremiah M. Collins, Jr. provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Lance Corporal Jeremiah M. Collins, Jr.; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held on October 19, 2013;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by federal and state law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin may be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Saturday, October 19, 2013**, and ending at sunset on that date.
