

EXECUTIVE ORDER #134

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Former Governor Patrick Lucey

WHEREAS, on May 10, 2014, Patrick Lucey passed away at the age of ninety-six; and

WHEREAS, Patrick Lucey served with distinction from 1971 to 1977 as the thirtyeighth governor of the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, in 1977, Patrick Lucey was named by President Carter as the United States Ambassador to Mexico, a position he held until 1979; and

WHEREAS, Patrick Lucey also served honorably in the United States Army from 1941 to 1945, in the Wisconsin State Assembly from 1949 to 1951, and as the Lieutenant Governor of Wisconsin from 1965 to 1967; and

WHEREAS, Patrick Lucey was a dedicated public servant who devoted many years of his life to serving the State of Wisconsin and the United States of America;

NOW THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of this State, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at halfstaff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin located in the State beginning at sunrise on May 13, 2014 until sunset on the date of interment.
