EXECUTIVE ORDER #246

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff on National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day

WHEREAS, on the morning of December 7, 1941, a surprise attack on the United States Naval Base at Pearl Harbor drew the United States into World War II, during which over 300,000 Wisconsinites served in the Armed Forces;

WHEREAS, the devastating attack took the lives of 2,403 Americans, including more than 50 service members from Wisconsin, and wounded more than 1,000 others;

WHEREAS, December 7 of every year has since been designated by the United States Congress as "National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day" to commemorate this solemn occasion and honor the individuals whose lives were lost; and

WHEREAS, on this occasion we are called to remember the heroism, sacrifice, and valor exhibited that fateful day, as well as recognize the enduring legacy of our veterans, including the nearly 1,800 World War II veterans living in Wisconsin.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State, hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin, beginning at sunrise on Saturday, December 7, 2024, and ending at sunset on that date.



IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this fifth day of December in the year of two thousand twenty-four.
