

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

2005 Wisconsin Act 445 [2005 Senate Bill 286]

School District Human Growth and Development Programs

Under **current law**, a school board may provide an instructional program in human growth and development in grades kindergarten to 12. The program may include instruction in a number of areas, including self-esteem, interpersonal relationships, discouragement of adolescent sexual activity, family life, parenting skills, human sexuality, family planning, and sex stereotypes.

Current law provides that if a school board provides instruction in any of the following areas, the school board must also provide instruction in marriage and parental responsibility:

- 1. Human sexuality.
- 2. Reproduction.
- 3. Family planning, including natural family planning.
- 4. Human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.
- 5. Prenatal development.
- 6. Childbirth.
- 7. Adoption.
- 8. Available prenatal and postnatal support.
- 9. Male and female responsibility.

2005 Wisconsin Act 445 provides that if a school board provides instruction in any of the subjects listed above, it must also ensure that instruction related to those areas do all of the following:

- 1. Presents abstinence from sexual activity as the preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all sexual activity for unmarried pupils.
- 2. Emphasizes that abstinence from sexual activity before marriage is the most effective way to prevent pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including human immunodeficiency virus and acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.

Effective Date: The Act takes effect on July 1, 2006.

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
