

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

2009 Wisconsin Act 162 [2009 Senate Bill 482]

Practice of Athletic Trainers

2009 Wisconsin Act 162 makes the following changes with regard to the regulation and practice of athletic trainers:

- Changes the practice of athletic trainers from authorizing various practice activities relating to
 "athletic injuries," to authorizing various practice activities relating to "injuries or illnesses
 sustained while participating in physical activity." "Physical activity" is defined as "vigorous
 participation in exercise, sports, games, recreation, wellness, fitness, or employment activities."
- Permits athletic trainers to engage in the following additional practices:
 - Rehabilitating and physically reconditioning injuries or illnesses that impede or prevent an
 individual from returning to participation in physical activity, if the individual recently
 participated in, and intends to return to participation in, physical activity.
 - o Establishing or administering risk management, conditioning, and injury prevention programs.
- Changes the name of the entity that may certify an athletic trainer to the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification, Inc., or its successor agency.
- Provides that an athletic trainer does not need a referral to provide athletic training to an individual, except a written referral is required to provide athletic training for rehabilitating and physically reconditioning injuries or illnesses sustained while participating in physical activity; or for rehabilitating and physically reconditioning injuries or illnesses that impede or prevent an individual from returning to participation in physical activity, if the individual recently participated in, and intends to return to participation in, physical activity.

Effective date: 2009 Wisconsin Act 162 takes effect on March 30, 2010.
