## 2011 Wisconsin Act 29 [2011 Senate Bill 15]

## **Traffic Stop Data Collection**

2011 Wisconsin Act 29 relates to the collection and analysis of motor vehicle traffic stop information and law enforcement training standards.

Act 29 repeals the traffic stop data collection provisions created in 2009 Wisconsin Act 28 (the 2009-11 Biennial Budget). The Act specifically repeals the rule-making authority of the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) relating to the types of information that law enforcement agencies must collect regarding the driver and occupants of each motor vehicle stopped by an officer, and repeals the requirement that OJA analyze the information submitted to it by law enforcement agencies.

The Act also repeals the requirement for a cultural diversity training session for all state, local, and tribal law enforcement officers.

The Act requires that any system development to implement the traffic stop data collection must be terminated on the effective date of the Act.

Effective date: Act 29 takes effect on June 30, 2011.
