Testimony of a Child in a Criminal Proceeding for a Human Trafficking Crime

2023 WISCONSIN ACT 238

2023 Wisconsin Act 238 expands the circumstances in which a court may order that the testimony of a child witness in a criminal trial be taken in a room other than the courtroom and simultaneously televised in the courtroom by means of closed-circuit audiovisual equipment. Specifically, if the trial is for a prosecution for a violation of the crime of human trafficking or trafficking of a child, the court may make such an order if the trial in which the child may be called as a witness will commence prior to the child's 18th birthday and the court finds both of the following:

- The presence of the defendant during the taking of the child's testimony will result in the child suffering serious emotional distress such that the child cannot reasonably communicate.
- Taking the testimony of the child in a room other than the courtroom and simultaneously televising
 the testimony in the courtroom by means of closed-circuit audiovisual equipment is necessary to
 minimize the trauma to the child of testifying in the courtroom setting and to provide a setting more
 amenable to securing the child witness's uninhibited, truthful testimony.
