**2005 Assembly Bill 1010**

*Assembly Bill 1010* modifies current law relating to seizure of computers used in committing a child sex offense and requires that certain conditions relating to computer use be placed on persons who are under supervision (e.g., on probation) for a child sex offense. Under the bill, “computer” is defined as an electronic device that performs logical, arithmetic, and memory functions by manipulating electronic or magnetic impulses, and includes all input, output, processing, storage, computer software, and communication facilities that are connected or related to a computer in a computer system or computer network.

*Assembly Amendment 1* provides that, under the bill, “computer” means a computer, as defined in the bill, that may be used to send electronic mail or to view or to listen to computerized child pornography.

### *Legislative History*

Assembly Amendment 1 was offered by Representatives Schneider, Vukmir, and Staskunas. On February 23, 2006, the Assembly adopted Assembly Amendment 1 on a voice vote and passed the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 95; Noes, 0; Paired, 2.
