

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

2005 Senate Bill 433

Senate Amendments 1 and 2

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Senate Bill 433 creates an enterprise development fund, from which the Department of Administration (DOA) may transfer moneys to executive branch agencies for information technology development projects. The bill provides that the fund consists of moneys DOA transfers from appropriation accounts (except for sum sufficient accounts) made to executive branch agencies other than the Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin System; moneys from gifts, grants, and bequests made for information technology development purposes; moneys DOA reallocates to the fund from other funds; and revenue from fees that the bill would permit DOA, or an agency to which DOA delegates purchasing authority, to charge for listing prospective vendors on a bidders list for state procurement opportunities.

Senate Amendment 1 specifies that the moneys described above that DOA transfers to the enterprise development fund from appropriation accounts made to executive branch agencies must be from general purpose revenues. The amendment also deletes bill provisions prohibiting interest from being chargeable to the enterprise development fund as a result of temporary reallocation of surplus moneys (inter-fund borrowing) under s. 20.002 (11), Stats.

Senate Amendment 2 deletes the bill provision that would allow DOA, or any agency to which the DOA delegates purchasing authority, to charge a fee for listing on a bidders list and deletes related bill provisions for depositing revenues from such fees into the enterprise development fund. (Current law that allows DOA to charge a fee to vendors for DOA-provided services relating to a DOA subscription service containing information on state procurement opportunities would not be affected.)

## Legislative History

Senate Amendments 1 and 2 were offered by Senator Kanavas. On January 24, 2006, the Senate Committee on Veterans, Homeland Security, Military Affairs, Small Business and Government Reform recommended adoption of Senate Amendments 1 and 2, and passage of Senate Bill 433 as amended, all on votes of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
