

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

Generally, 2007 Senate Bill 223 permits a city or village to include certain expenditures in the project costs of a tax incremental district (TID) in addition to project costs permitted under current law. Under the bill, expenditures may be included as project costs of a TID if incurred within one-half mile of the TID boundary and approved by the joint review board for the TID.

Senate Amendment 1 creates the additional requirement that expenditures made within one-half mile of a TID boundary must also be made within the city that created the TID in order to be included as project costs of the TID.

Legislative History

Senate Bill 223 was introduced on July 2, 2007 by Senator Plale and others; cosponsored by Representative Newcomer and others, and was referred to the Senate Committee on Commerce, Utilities, and Rail.

On September 27, 2007, the Senate Committee on Commerce, Utilities, and Rail offered Senate Amendment 1 to the bill.

The Senate Committee on Commerce, Utilities, and Rail recommended adoption of Senate Amendment 1 to Senate Bill 223 by a vote of Ayes, 7; Noes, 0, and recommended passage of Senate Bill 223, as amended, by a vote of Ayes, 7; Noes, 0, on September 27, 2007.
