

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

Under current law, a county department of social services or human services (county department) may, under certain circumstances, pay the funeral and burial expenses of a decedent who received certain public assistance programs, including Wisconsin Works and Medical Assistance. *The county department only pays a reimbursement if the total funeral and burial expenses do not exceed \$3,500.* If the total funeral and burial expenses not paid by the estate and other persons, *up to \$1,500.* 

Under 2009 Senate Bill 338 (the bill), if the total funeral and burial expenses do not exceed \$4,500, then the county department shall pay the funeral and burial expenses not paid by the estate and other persons, up to \$1,500.

The bill first applies to funeral and burial expenses incurred on account of deaths that occurred on the effective date of the bill.

## <u>Senate Amendment 1</u>

Senate Amendment 1 clarifies that the effective date of the bill is January 1, 2011.

## Legislative History

On March 17, 2010, the Joint Committee on Finance introduced Senate Amendment 1 by a vote of Ayes, 16; Noes, 0, and recommended adoption by a vote of Ayes, 16; Noes, 0. The committee recommended passage of the bill, as amended, by a vote of Ayes, 16; Noes, 0.

On April 13, 2010, the Senate adopted Senate Amendment 1 by a voice vote. The Senate passed the bill, as amended, by a vote of Ayes, 22; Noes, 11. The bill, as amended, was then messaged to the Assembly.
