<u>Senate Bill 38</u>

2009 Senate Bill 38 would require the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to offer annual state park vehicle admission receipts for buses. Under the bill, the fee for an annual vehicle admission receipt for a bus with Wisconsin registration plates would be \$299.50 and the fee for the second and subsequent annual vehicle admission receipts for buses with Wisconsin registration plates owned by the same business or entity would be \$49.50. The fee for an annual vehicle admission receipt for a bus with registration plates from another state would be \$449.50 and the fee for the second and subsequent annual vehicle admission receipts for buses with registration plates from another state would be \$449.50 and the fee for the second and subsequent annual vehicle admission receipts for buses with registration plates from another state would be \$449.50 and the fee for the second and subsequent annual vehicle admission receipts for buses with registration plates from another state owned by the same business or entity would be \$49.50.

<u>Senate Substitute Amendment 1</u>

Senate Substitute Amendment 1 would require DNR to provide a 50% discount of the total amount of fees paid for state park daily vehicle admission receipts by a business or entity during a calendar year if all of the following are true:

- The business or entity receives at least 50 daily vehicle admission receipts in its initial transaction for the calendar year.
- The business or entity purchases its vehicle admission receipts directly from DNR staff.
- The business or entity owns motor buses.

This discount would apply to fees paid for motor buses and other vehicles, and would not be available through the DNR automated licensing system.

Legislative History
