

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

2013 Assembly Bill 485	Assembly Substitute Amendment 1

Current law requires a food processing license before operating a food processing plant, which is defined as any place where food processing is conducted. Food processing includes the preparation, including packaging, of food for sale.

2013 Assembly Bill 485 exempts, from the food processing license requirement, a person who sells eggs if all of the following apply:

- The eggs are from the person's flock.
- The eggs are sold directly to a consumer at a farmer's market located in this state.
- The person labels the carton in which the person packs the eggs with the person's name and address, the date the eggs were packed, and a date that falls no more than 30 days after the date on which the eggs were packed by which the eggs must be sold.
- The person keeps the packaged eggs at an ambient temperature of 45 degrees Fahrenheit or below at all times prior to sale.

Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 differs from the bill in the following respects.

The Substitute Amendment defines the following terms:

- "Candling" means carefully examining, in a dark place, the interior and exterior of a whole egg that is placed in front of a strong light source.
- "Egg" means the shell egg of the domestic chicken, Gallus gallus domesticus, and of turkey, duck, goose, guinea, or other avian species whose eggs are used for human consumption.

- "Egg producer" means a person who sells eggs laid only by a bird or a flock of birds owned by that person.
- "Egg sales route" means one or more residences inhabited by consumers who regularly buy eggs from an egg producer who travels to the residences.
- "Farmer's market" means a building, structure, or place where two or more individuals gather on a regular, recurring basis to sell, directly to the consumer, any of the following:
 - Raw agricultural commodities that are grown, harvested, or collected by the individual.
 - Food that is prepared by the individual.
- "Nest-run egg" means an egg that is not washed, graded, or subject to candling before sale.

The Substitute Amendment exempts an egg producer who sells eggs, including nest-run eggs, from the food processing license requirement if the producer satisfies all of the following:

- The number of egg-laying birds in the egg producer's flock may not exceed 150.
- The eggs are sold on an egg sales route and at the premises where the eggs were laid, in addition to farmer's markets.
- The carton in which the eggs are packed must be labeled with a statement that the eggs are ungraded and uninspected, in addition to the other information in the original bill.
- The egg producer must keep the eggs at an ambient temperature of 41degrees, rather than 45 degrees as in the original bill.

Bill History

On January 7, 2014, the Assembly Committee on Consumer Protection recommended adoption of Assembly Substitute Amendment 1, and recommended passage of the bill, as amended, both on votes of Ayes, 8; Noes, 0.
